Great Docent work done this day

On a recent Wednesday, docents Barbara Maxfield & Rita Tucker were working the morning shift. A couple from Quincy, IL, Jim & Lois Perry, walked in the door. As Rita greeted them and began a conversation, Mr. Perry told her that he was in Calistoga looking for an old war buddy, a man he had served with in the early 1970s, a man he met during their Air Force days at Castle Air Force Base in Merced, CA.

Once they had been discharged, Mr. Perry's buddy told him he was going home to Calistoga to attend to the family home and property. Mr. Perry had visited once decades ago but could not quite remember where his friend's home was, nor did he have a phone number.

Barbara and Rita kept talking with him, getting

descriptions of the home, the area, a blacksmith shop? Our docents took notes and were given Mr. Perry's business card being unable at that point to answer his needs. Rather than simply putting the note in one of our Director's boxes, or leaving it taped to the cash register, Rita called me at home. Perfect docent procedure!

It was important for our visitor to see his old war buddy. And this need became our mission. I got all the information from Rita, then spoke to Barbara for even more info.

My husband, Dan, happened to walk in the door. Dan is born and raised Calistoga. I asked him if he knew the "buddy" (name omitted for privacy). Dan said "Yes of course", the buddy still lived in the family home.

I telephoned Mr. Perry immediately with the

good news. Luckily he and his wife were still in town enjoying a meal at Café Sarafornia. Dan took the phone, had quite a conversation with Mr. Perry and gave him clues and directions to his buddy's home.

Long story short, due to the efforts of docents Barbara Maxfield and Rita Tucker, a simple phone call to me at home and with my husband's help, old Air Force war buddies met again after nearly 50 years.

This is what the Sharp-steen is about. Never let a question or inquiry go unanswered; always go the extra step. I am so proud of what was accomplished on this day. We have the best docents that can be found anywhere!

Book Store: Best book ever on basket weaving

"Indian Basketry of Central California, Art Culture and History" by Ralph Shanks, M.A. and Lisa Woo Shanks

Covering Native American basketry from San Francisco Bay and Monterey Bay north to Mendocino and east to the Sierras, this is by far the best and most informative book we have seen on the great art of basket weaving of the First People of California. It also includes multiple references and examples of our local Wappo Tribe.


Nearly 200 full color photographs and drawings illustrate the rare, fine California Indian baskets from great museums and private collections in the US and Europe. Readers can learn to identify baskets from their personal collections,

learn to recognize plant materials used, and distinguish weaving techniques.

Ralph Shanks, VP of the Miwok Archeological Preserve of Marin, has conducted over two decades of research with basketry scholars and anthropologists across the country and Europe as well as working extensively with Native American cultural leaders, weavers and elders.
