York Cabin Monument Rediscovered

Hidden from sight for many years is the monument dedicated to pioneer John York, born 1820. York, his wife, Lucinda, (nee Hudson), as well as additional family members came west via wagon train in 1845, ultimately settling in Hot Springs Township more than 20 years before Calistoga was established. According to the California Office of Historic Preservation, York's log cabin is among the first




homes in this area, constructed in October of 1845. Thankfully, due to the constant vigilance of local historian and direct descendant, Betty McCormick Malmgren, the current property owner took it upon himself to clean the monument, removing all plant life and debris. California State Historic Landmark #682 is the

site of John York's log cabin built in October 1845. The home was rebuilt as part of the home of the Kortum Family and was used as a residence until razed in 1930. Location: SW Corner of Hwy. 29 (Foothill Blvd.) and Lincoln Ave. A monument was erected on this site in 1959. Please see sidebar at right for a list of landmarks in the Calistoga area.

Nearby was the cabin of David Hudson, also built in 1845. Although no monument or memorial plaque has yet to be set, the site of the Hudson Cabin, California State Historic Landmark # 683 is located at: NE corner of Hwy. 29 (Foothill Blvd.) and Lincoln Ave.

Both men were well known, stalwart pioneers of the finest kind who helped develop the upper portion of the Napa Valley by purchasing land, clearing it, planting crops and building homes, to say the least.

John and Lucinda York and David Hudson, along with generations of descendants are interred in the St. Helena Cemetery.


